- We talked about the Starliner space flight, that the return went well, it came back without humans, but what other life forms?
- Don recovered from COVID.
- We discussed Radio Shack TRS-80's... Kevin's was a portable 4P model, fully backwards compatible. Scott asked what processor was used...it was a Z80 4 mhz.Scott has a ZX 81.
- Don upgraded his 130XE to 16K, years ago, for \$120. Members in the SLCC thought he
 was lying. One can upgrade to 320K. The ZX81 was slower after an upgrade to 16K
 Rampak.

He found an Atari 600XL, although off-color, brown, but hasn't tested it...he needed a display. He has a PBM 1390 Sony Trinitron monitor that doesn't look industrial, with composite, S-Video. It looks great, but wasn't cheap. Does it have sound? Yes, he said.Ron showed the "industrial" monitor, and Richard said he should make a new, 3D badge.
- Richard showed processor cables and Dallas adapters and VARTA battery PC boards.Ron asked if the pins match. Richard said the battery fits in the VARTA board.
- Don needs to replace soldered in HAM radio batteries which are corroded.
