Notes For SLCC Zoom Meeting 2-25-2025

Hosted by Kevin

In Attendance Kevin, Robbie, Don, Scott, Richard, Ron, Bob

Quick recap

• The team reminisced about their experiences with classic arcade games, cassette tapes, and VHS rewinders, and shared personal updates and anecdotes. They also discussed various technologies, including vintage computers, Google's Gemini, and Microsoft's code solutions, and shared their experiences with beekeeping and agricultural tax exemption. Lastly, they discussed an electrical issue with a GFCI outlet in Robbie's backyard and the possibility of reviving the rivalry between Apple, Atari, and Commodore computers from the 1980s.

Summary

Tape Issues and Retro Entertainment Memories

• Robbie discusses issues with some of his cassette tapes not playing properly, despite attempts to fix them by fast-forwarding and rewinding. The group reminisces about VHS rewinders shaped like cars, with Kevin mentioning he had one that looked like a combination of a Corvette and a Ferrari. They also share memories of renting movies from Blockbuster and shopping at Half Price Books. Robbie mentions that his daughter-in-law enjoyed playing Hubert on a cartridge provided by Richard, but notes that Breakout isn't included on it.

Classic Arcade Games and Memories

Personal and Professional Updates Discussed

Bob was busy sorting through his inventory, while Don was working on a train route he had been reworking. Scott shared his recent activities, including playing games on a cartridge and updating his tax computer. Beekeeping Experiences and Agricultural Tax

• Scott shared his recent beekeeping experiences, including inspecting his hives and finding the queen in both. He added a deep brood box to one hive and plans to add a honey super in the spring. Scott also mentioned that he has ordered four more hives and aims to extract honey for sale at the farmers market. The team discussed the potential for agricultural tax exemption after five years of beekeeping. Richard suggested adding goats or cows, but Scott clarified that he lives in the city limits and needs at least 5 acres for the exemption.

Honey Uses and Beekeeping Discussion

• The team discussed various uses for honey, including as a spread on toast, in coffee, and as a skin moisturizer. Technology Experiences and Challenges Discussed
